Treaty.

The Treaty committed each member to share the risk, responsibilities and benefits of collective defence – a concept at the very heart of the Alliance. In 1949, the primary aim of the Treaty was to create a pact of mutual assistance to counter the risk that the Soviet Union would seek to extend its control of Eastern Europe to other parts of the continent. The Treaty also required members not to enter into any international commitments that conflicted with the Treaty and committed them to the purposes and principles of the Charter of the United Nations (UN). Moreover, it stated that NATO members formed a unique community of values committed to the principles of individual liberty, democracy, human rights and the rule of law.

In addition to collective defence and key values, the principle of consensus decision-making and the importance of consultation define the spirit of the Organization, together with its defensive nature and its flexibility.

The signing of the Treaty led to the creation of the Alliance and, only later, did a fully-fledged organisation develop. In effect, the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) provides the structure which enables the goals of the Alliance to be implemented. To date, those goals have not fundamentally changed nor the Treaty been rewritten. The only so-called “amendments” made so far stem from the series of accession protocols which have been added as new members join, illustrating the foresight of its drafters and their ability to marry international concerns and objectives with national interests.

Most readers are certainly familiar with the 20th century history and the machinations of the Cold War. Why would we need to bring it up now, when there is a three-colored flag flying over Moscow, a crowned double-headed eagle in the Kremlin, and the poisonings are being done by an organization called the FSB (The Federal Security Service of the Russian Federation), not the KGB? When there is no clear ideological war between the East and the West, and the Cold War—at least from a larger distance, or from a geopolitical standpoint—seems over? Because the Cold War—in some aspects at least—is far from being over. Russia has not broken all legal continuity with the Soviet Union. The KGB officials have not been send to prison. The 20th century archives have not been made public.

Instead, the KGB officials now reside in the Kremlin, celebrating the Chekist day—20th of December, when their organization was founded... in 1917. They conveniently control all legal processes—with no distinction between powers and no rule of law. Journalists that know too much of their campaigns are frequently found dead, and the investigations mysteriously stop (like in the instance of Anna Politkovskaya, who specialized in the Chechnya war).[2]

In the year 1999, when what was then called FSB managed to install their man—Vladimir Putin—in the Kremlin, he addressed the FSB agents by saying “We are BACK in power, this time—indefinitely.” Why “back?” Because the employment structure between the KGB and the FSB has not changed at all. One could compare it to keeping Gestapo in the office after the supposed “fall” of Hitler (at least the Third Reich, thankfully, has actually fallen). Putin then proceeded to restore the Russian anthem to its Soviet melody, and changed the symbolic worn by the Russian army back to those from the Soviet times.

In 2000, Nikolai Patrushev, the FSB Director, gave an interview to a newspaper called *Komsomolskaya Pravda*, one of the largest media outlets in Russia (the word “Komsomolskaya” relates to *Komsomol*, the All-Union Leninist Young Communist League established in 1918), stating that:

“We did not throw away our history. We are openly admitting that the history of Lubyanka [the CheKa/GPU/NKVD/KGB/FSB headquarters] in the 20th century is our history.”

The interview was published on the 20th of December—the Chekist day.

Владимир Путин was born in 1952. In the early years after that speech (he was 9 in 1961), little Vladimir was busy reading Marx, Engels and Lenin. By the time the alleged communist utopia was supposed to have been built (1981), Putin, aged 29, was a member of the Communist party, and a spy for the KGB.

He would stay in the KGB for 16 years (1975 – 1991), rising to the rank of lieutenant colonel.

Export of grain and other food [edit]

After recognition of the famine situation in Ukraine during the drought and poor harvests, the Soviet government in Moscow continued to export grain rather than retain its crop to feed the people,^[74] though at a lower rate than in previous years.^[75] In 1930–1931, there had been 5,832,000 metric tons of grains exported. In 1931–1932, grain exports declined to 4,786,000 metric tons. In 1932–1933, grain exports were just 1,607,000 metric tons, and this further declined to 1,441,000 metric tons in 1933–1934.^[76] Officially published data^[77] differed slightly.

- 1930 – 4,846,024
- 1931 – 5,182,835
- 1932 – 1,819,114 (~750,000 during the first half of 1932; from late April –157,000 tonnes of grain was also imported)

In 1932, via Ukrainian commercial ports were exported 985,300 tons of grains and 16,500 tons of other types of cereals. In 1933, the totals were 809,600 tons of grains, 2,600 tons of other cereals, 3,500 tons of meat, 400 tons of butter, and 2,300 tons of fish. Those same ports imported less than 47,200 tons of grains and cereals in 1932, and 8,600 tons of grains in 1933.^[citation needed]

From other Soviet ports were received 164,000 tons of grains, 7,300 tons of other cereals, 31,500 tons of flour,^[79] and no more than 177,000 tons of meat and butter in 1932, and 230,000 tons of grains, 15,500 tons of other cereals, 100 tons of meat, 900 tons of butter, and 34,300 tons of fish in 1933.^[citation needed]

Famine of 1946-7



Famine of 1946-7. A year after the end of the Second World War, many of the inhabitants of central and eastern Ukraine experienced hunger as a result of a drought that exacerbated the general wartime collapse of agriculture. But the Soviet government refused to lower delivery quotas on grain and other products that it had imposed on the peasants. Moreover, the authorities pushed hard for the delivery of foodstuffs and threatened local officials for hoarding or sabotage if they failed to meet their quotas. A substantial amount of the foodstuffs that were requisitioned were exported to Soviet-controlled Poland, Czechoslovakia, and Bulgaria. As a result of the onerous food confiscation, famine conditions emerged.

The famine did not occur in newly annexed Western Ukraine because the collective-farm system (see Collective farm) had not yet been introduced there and the resistance of the Ukrainian Insurgent Army rendered food procurement difficult. Therefore many peasants traveled there from Ukraine's central and eastern oblasts to beg for bread, and in the summer of 1946 trains going westward were crammed with starving people. The authorities tried to stop the exodus by police methods, forbidding western Ukrainian peasants to sell food to newcomers and spreading rumors of epidemics and poisoned food in the western oblasts.

The Soviet regime did not acknowledge that a famine occurred in Ukraine in 1946-7. Estimates of the number of people who died vary widely, ranging from 100,000 to upwards of one million.

The mass famine in Soviet Moldavia in 1946-47 is one of the least known episodes of state terror under Stalin. It took the life of at least 123,000 persons which made about 5% of the entire population of MSSR and thus the excess deaths proportionally to the total population was 5 times higher than in Ukraine and 11 times than in Russia in the same period. Among the explanations of these huge discrepancies is that the greatest part of MSSR (Bessarabia) was not yet collectivized, it was a borderland republic and part of the former Nazi Germany's ally - Romania, and the local elites were more servile to the Center than the Ukrainian ones. At the same time, the famine in Moldavia and at the all-Union level as well was triggered by decisions taken in Moscow by Stalin personally as he was well-informed about the real situation before and during the famine erupted (Chisinau-based archives and Moscow ones - the latter accessed through Hoover Institution archives - testifies for that). While acknowledging the assistance that Soviet regime accorded to Soviet Moldavia to fight the famine, the high death toll that nevertheless resulted raises serious questions as to the intentions of the Soviets in the former Rumanian province of Bessarabia. In conclusion, the author supports the idea that the famine of 1946-47 in Soviet Moldavia in particular and in Soviet Ukraine and Russia as well was another of Stalin's genocides. The article thus

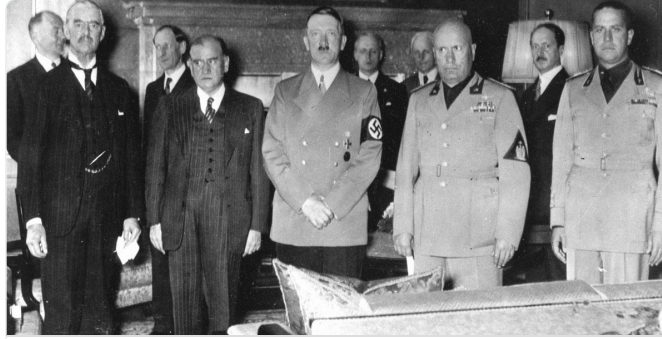

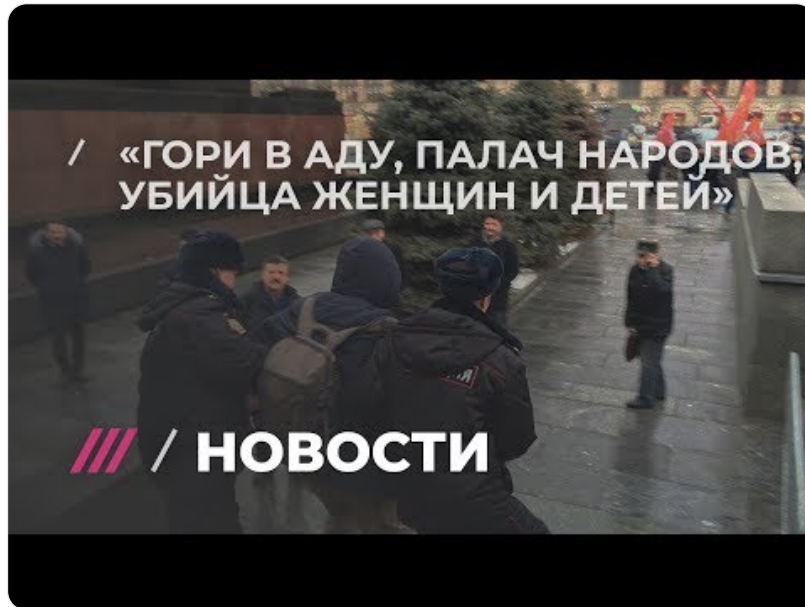

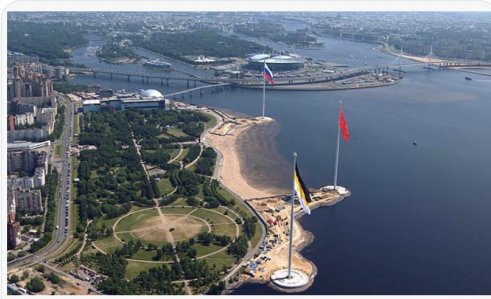
