

On Friday, April 9, 2010, Amnesty International announced my departure from the organization. The agreed statement said, "Due to irreconcilable differences of view over policy between Gita Sahgal and Amnesty International regarding Amnesty International's relationship with Moazzam Begg and Cageprisoners, it has been agreed that Gita will leave Amnesty International."

I was hired as the head of the Gender Unit as the organization began to develop its Stop Violence Against Women campaign. I leave with great sadness as the campaign is closed. Thousands of activists of Amnesty International enthusiastically joined the campaign. Many hoped that it would induce respect for women's human rights in every area of social and economic life. Today, there is little ground for optimism.

Dyab Abou Jahjah is one of four individuals scheduled to speak at the rally. He has <u>called</u> the 9/11 attacks "sweet revenge," <u>said</u> Europe made "the cult of the Holocaust and

Jew-worshiping its alternative religion," and <u>labeled</u> gays "AIDS-spreading faggots." He has also <u>questioned</u> the existence of the Nazi gas chambers, and is a former fighter for the <u>anti-Semitic</u> group Hezbollah, an officially designated terrorist group by the U.S. and European Union. For his hateful activism, Abou Jahjah has been banned in the United Kingdom since 2009. 3. Holding Ukraine, not Russia, responsible for Russia's invasion of Ukraine and indiscriminate attacks on residential areas.



The release of the Amnesty International press release "Ukraine: Ukrainian fighting tactics endanger civilians" on August 4th, has unleashed a torrent of criticism against the assertions made in it and any suggestion that Ukraine, the victim of Russian aggression, is endangering its own population. The Amnesty report has been rightly criticized by many experts in international humanitarian law (IHL) for poor methodology in which reported information is not verified through other sources, lack of context for the current conflict and even failure to incorporate key IHL concept of proportionately in use of forces. The storm unleashed by this report not only damages the image of Ukraine but, more importantly, this

Multiple Western scholars of international and military law went on social media to reject the human shield claim. They said the report contained poor phrasing that muddied legal distinctions and ignored the combat conditions in Ukraine.

United Nations war crimes investigator Marc Garlasco, tweeting in a personal capacity Friday, accused Amnesty International of "getting the law wrong" and said Ukraine was taking steps to protect civilians, such as helping them relocate.
